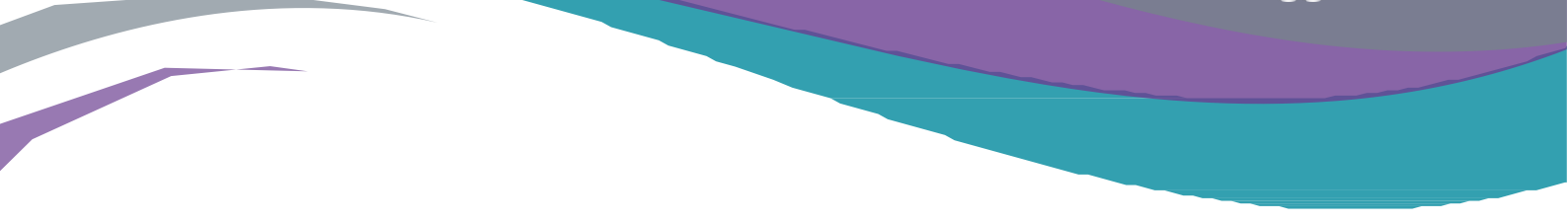

For Authors

1. Prior to final submissions of manuscripts the JCPR invites interested authors to submit a 200 - 250 word abstract with relevant keywords via email at jcpr@nwu.a.c.za.
 2. Upon approval of the submitted abstract and keywords by the Special Issue Editors, the authors are provided with the final submission date for full manuscripts.
 3. The submitted manuscript will be submitted for peer review by at least two independent reviewers.
 4. Reviewed manuscripts will be evaluated by the Special Issue Editors. Recommendations and/or possible revisions will be sent to the authors (The editorial board and Special Issue Editors hold the right to the final decision for publication in the JCPR, based on recommendations from the independent reviewers).
 5. Upon final acceptance authors will approve the final galley proof, provide final proof of payment, and sign a copy of the Creative Commons License 4.0.
